<p>1. Draw a portrait of you and your family. Can you write who their names?</p> 	<p>1. Can you start a height chart for your family members? how tall are you now? who's taller or shorter than you? Talk about the differences with your family.</p>

3. Can you use your bodies' senses to explore your home or the local area?
