Autumn Term (2)

This half-term the children's learning will be linked to the theme of 'Light and Dark'.

To further your child's learning at home (ie. to reinforce and extend what they have been learning at school) we have suggested some activities below.

We would like your child to complete four maths and four topic activities.

These can be done over the next seven weeks (this half-term).

Depending on the nature of the activity, the amount of time you have to spend doing home learning or even your child's attention span, you may wish to complete just one activity a week or alternatively do two and then have a week off!

Remember, you can record Home Learning in this book (this may be a note, drawing, photo etc) or you can post photographs or video clips on your child's Tapestry account.

Home Learning books will be collected in on a Tuesday so that your class teacher can have a look at the wonderful learning happening at home!

Please support your child in completing these activities and have fun!

Maths activities

Choose four from this column to complete

1. Help tidy your room at home by sorting your toys into groups- put all of your cars together, all of your dolls together etc.



2. Go for a muddy puddle walk. Look at the patterns and shapes your footprints make. Count your footprints as you make them. How many steps did you take on your walk? Can you write that number outside using sticks in the mud?



Topic Activities

Choose four from this column to complete

1. Make a fireworks picture. Talk about the sounds and colours that the fireworks make. Find out how to keep ourselves and animals safe on bonfire night.



2. Look at the sky at night time. What can you see? If you went on a rocket into space what other things would you see? Build a rocket/spaceship and pretend to go on an adventure into space. Don't forget to visit the other planets and the space station!



3. Make a birthday card for a friend in class or at home. Write the person's age on the front of the card. Talk about what month of the year your child's birthday is on. Can you name the months of the year?



3. Find out about the Diwali story of Rama and Sita. What was your favourite part of the story? Can you retell the story? (Festival of Lights)



4. Use strips of paper to make paper chains. Compare the lengths using 'shortest', 'longest'. Have a go at measuring one of the chains using cms. Record the length together.



4. Find out which animals hibernate in the winter. Make a picture of these animals using autumn leaves or other craft materials.



5. Have a teddy bear's picnic at home. Ask the child to share the plates, knives, forks and cups between the bears. Share out cakes/ biscuits/ fruit. How many cakes do they have each? Can you share them equally?



5. Make a decoration for a celebration using recycled objects from around your house.



6. Go on a number hunt. What is the biggest number you can find? How many numbers do you recognise? What is the highest number you can count to?



6. Talk to your family and friends about what their favourite celebration is and why.
