We would like your child to complete three maths and three topic activities.


These can be done over the next six weeks (this half-term).

<p>1. Grow a sunflower at home. Talk about what it needs to help it grow. Take photos of your sunflower as it grows and measure how tall your sunflower is each week. Is it as tall as you? Is it as tall as someone else in your family?</p> 	<p>1. Make a zigzag book about the lifecycle of a mini-beast, for example frogspawn, tadpole, frog.</p> 
<p>2. Look for patterns in nature. Draw the patterns and then try to create your own.</p>  	<p>2. Design and make a healthy pizza at home. Where have all of the ingredients to make your pizza come from?</p> 

3. Create a butterfly that is symmetrical - fold butterfly shaped paper in half, open it and paint on one side, fold it together again and see what happens!



3. Draw a picture of one of the mini-beasts that you found and write a fact about it. Remember when you write a sentence to 'think it, say it, write it, read it'.



4. Go on a mini-beast hunt with your grown-up. How many different mini-beasts can you find? Keep a tally using a chart.


