Raising concerns

If you have a concern about your child or the school please contact us directly. The class teacher is usually the best person to speak to in the first instance. Class teachers are happy to deal with day to day matters at the beginning and end of the school day. However, if you need a longer conversation we ask you to make an appointment. Class teachers are very busy at the beginning and end of the school day so if there is a more complex urgent concern then members of the leadership team are usually available to speak to families at these times.

It is important to highlight that we do not respond to concerns that are raised on social media. While we may occasionally hear about comments that have been posted we feel the best way to resolve any problems is to contact the school and arrange a meeting. Staff are not permitted to contact or reply to contacts made via social media.




Join in the fun and dress up as a book character to celebrate World Book Day!
